Now the BGF Patron, David was distinguished as being the last family Managing Director of Royal Brierly (formerly Stevens & Williams) that first commenced trading in 1840.

And the flag? Well, the tale behind this is that having flown over the factory for many years it was 'rescued' by Charles Hajdamach in the last few days before the factory finally closed. Having ensured it has been kept securely ever since, on Monday 31st January 2022 David proudly handed over this symbol of excellence to Stourbridge Glass Museum for safe keeping in perpetuity.
